### All Species Changes for 2021—approved by Senior Fair Board/Superintendents/OSUE 12/14/2020

#### General

- REVOTED & APPROVED: Up to two market species may be exhibited following the guidelines
  of number of animals per species ex. I can show up to TWO market beef animals <u>and</u> up to
  TWO market hog animals; only one animal may sell unless owning two champions/reserve
  champions.
- Education Champions— volunteers in each species that work on setting up clinics and sharing educational information related to their species—contact Katie if interested in getting involved
- Addition of feeding of livestock being restricted to those outlined in Jr. Fair Livestock Rule 34. No professional groomers are permitted at the fair. A Jr. Fair exhibitor may receive assistance in the care, <u>feeding</u>, grooming, and preparation of the livestock entered in the Jr. Fair show, provided that the assistance is limited to explanation or minimal demonstration (member must be present) and that the assistance is provided only by the following: 1.
   Parents/guardians/grandparents 2. Siblings 3. Ross County 4-H/FFA members 4. Ross County 4-H
  - advisors 5. Ross County Ag Instructors...

- Beef Tag-in moved to March 6 from 9 am to 11 am during hoof trimming or March 8 from 6-8 pm at the Ross County Fairgrounds. No weigh-in and no rate-of-gain competitions for 2021. Animals must be able to walk into a chute without guide panels.
- Ross County Jr. Fair MARKET BEEF POSSESSION DATE is being MOVED TO MARCH 1 FOR 2021
   ONLY to allow more exhibitors to decide to take market beef and find an animal(s) based on the new decision to permit two market species to be exhibited at the fair. If choosing to exhibit at Ohio State Fair the possession deadline remains January 1.

#### Goat

- New Superintendents—Ryan Elliott, Heather Crago, Corey Williams Asst. Supers Alex Stewart and Nick Naumovski
- County Bred, Born, and Raised Returns—
  - Register Premise ID with Extension office by May 1. Breeders register; pay \$10 fee and provide list of exhibitors they sold animals to to the Ext office
  - Announce breeder when announcing youth winning
- Premier Goat Exhibitor (formerly Breeders Cup in 2020):
  - One premier exhibitor award will be given out to the Premier Goat Exhibitor in each contest—Dairy, Pygmy, Meat
  - The premier exhibitor awards will utilize a point-based system to determine the winners.
     Categories include:
    - 1. Showmanship
    - 2. Up to four goat class placings (specific for each contest)
      - o Goat class placings and showmanship points awarded:
        - 1<sup>st</sup> 10 points
        - 2<sup>nd</sup> 8 points
        - 3<sup>rd</sup> 6 points
        - 4<sup>th</sup> 4 points
        - 5<sup>th</sup> 2 points
    - 3. Placings for each contest based on:
      - Dairy goat placings dairy goat showmanship, dairy does, and dairy market goats
      - Meat goat placings the highest meat goat showmanship placing, meat breeding and market goat classes
      - Pygmy placings pygmy showmanship, pygmy does, and pygmy wethers
    - 4. In the event of a tie, a written quiz will be completed to determine the winner.
- Market Goat Show: Adding 5 divisions—Div.1=Dairy Wethers, Div.2-5 = Mkt Goats, resulting in the final drive consisting of 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> places for all divisions
  - 10 animals in Final Drive. Grand & Reserve & 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> over-all placing
  - \*\*\*Dairy Wethers show with market goats, showing in first division, will continue to sell

like normal and receive reduced packer price

- Senior Dairy Goats- producing doe currently in milk or has freshened at least once
- Jr. Fair Pygmy Classes- shown by class & age (as of August 1, current year)
  - \*NEW in 2021- Wethers & does will show separately

Grand & Reserve Pygmy Wethers will be selected and Grand & Reserve Pygmy Does will be selected.

- A. Pygmy Wether Show & Age Classes:
  - a) 3 years & over
  - b) 2 years 3 years
  - c) 1 year 2 years
  - d) 0-1 year
- B. Pygmy Doe Show & Age Classes:
  - a) 3 years & over
  - b) 2 years 3 years
  - c) 1 year 2 years
  - d) 0-1 year
- Class Age Change Dairy age breaks
  - Senior does: 1 year and under 3 years of age
  - Senior does: over 3 years of age
- Dairy Showed Dry option Does currently in milk OR has freshened at least once
- Non-market livestock form—will have a spot to differentiate dry yearlings and young senior does, ensure senior does have been freshened—last date freshened/kidded
- Breeding show class break changes
  - o Junior Meat Doe Kid- 0 to 5 months March 1 current year current show dates
  - Junior Meat Doe Kid- 5 to 8 months Feb. 28 current year Dec. 1 previous year
  - Junior Meat Doe Kid- 8 to 12 months Nov. 30 previous year August 1 previous year
  - Intermediate Doe- 12 to 24 months July 31, 2020 August 1, 2019 \*does not need to be currently in milk
  - Senior Doe- 24 months & older Prior to July 31, 2019
- Dairy Goat Market Wethers
  - Dairy market wether goats will be required to attend Spring Weigh-In like all other goats competing in the Market Goat Show.
    - They will be evaluated to determine if they qualify to be considered a dairy market wether goat at the Spring Weigh-In by at least 3 superintendents.
    - No evidence of a meat goat breed shall be present in a dairy goat market wether (Meat breeds include but are not limited to Boer, Kiko, Myotonic, Spanish, and Pygmy)
  - Follows same rules as meat market goats—dehorned, may be a wether or a doe, scrapie
     ID, born between January 1st to April 1st of current year, minimum 50 lbs, terminal show, sell according to the same procedure as the meat breed market goats
  - Dairy Goat Market Wether exhibitors will show in the market showmanship classes
- Effective in 2022- Market Goats must be born after December 1 (each YEAR)

- Showmanship classes will be 3 age divisions and Championships junior, intermediate, and senior. This will parallel the Showman of Showmen age divisions.
- There will be one English Championship, all ages.
- Times for Barrels and Poles will be combined, as before, for 2 age division Championships. (13 and under, 14 and over)
- Times for Cones and Barrels, Stakes Race, Keyhole, and Speed and Control will be combined, for a total of 2 age division championships (13 and under, 14 and over)
- There will be 2 age division Championships for Western, classes to include Western Pleasure and Western Horsemanship (13 and under, 14 and over)
- There will be 2 age division Championships for Ranch Horse, to include Ranch Riding and Ranch Horse Pleasure

#### Poultry

- New fan rule wording: Personal fans must be battery operated. The use of cords, wires or external power sources is prohibited.
- Chick pick up same drive through style

#### Rabbits

- Drive through weigh-in pre-fair
- Show Schedule—move Guinea Pig, Breeding, and Fancy to 4:00 pm Sunday
- Animal Move-Out will be on Friday

#### Sheep

All shows Wednesday—3pm Market, Breeding, then Showmanship

#### Swine

- Hog Hair Rule
  - o Remove 'face'—keep ears and tail wording
    - Each hog must have at least ½ inch minimum of measurable hair to be eligible for the show and sale. Body shaving/clipping of hogs is NOT a recommended practice. Clippers/scissors are not allowed in the barns and clipping of hogs is not allowed during the fair. Clipping of the hog's face, ears and tail ONLY is allowed but must be done prior to the animal coming to the fair. A ½ hair line approved ruling tool will be used to determine hair length by a paid hair judge. The hair judge's ruling is final and cannot be petitioned. Any violation of this rule....
  - Working with KNB on a credit card for all exhibitors and for judge to use that measures
     ½ inch
  - Hair must be checked before animal goes across the scales
