Advisors will have access to view club member enrollments and information once their profiles are active. Advisors cannot reactivate their own profiles without an up-to-date background check. If it's your year—please be sure to get your fingerprints sent to OSU asap.

After March 1, all project enrollment changes will have to be completed through the office. No advisors or family will be able to make project changes. All project enrollments will be final on April 1, 2024. Questions? Call Dawn for assistance.

MEMBERSHIP FEES/DUES

Should be submitted with ONE check by the club advisor from the club account. Dues should NOT be paid before MARCH 15 (PROJECT BOOK PICK UP) TO ALLOW TIME FOR CORRECTIONS TO ENROLLMENTS.

PROJECT BOOKS

Project books can be picked up starting **March 15**; books will not be ready before that date. Our county Project Requirement sheets (on coral paper) are inserted into every project book. Advisors should be reviewing these pages with their members! Requirements are divided into "4-H Project Requirements" and "Jr. Fair Information" sections. Evening Pick Up March 21 5:00 pm – 7:00 pm.

NEW ADVISOR ORIENTATION


All new advisors must attend an Advisor Orientation either in February or October (within 1 year of joining) to finalize their advisor onboarding. The next orientation is being held on:

REQUIRED CLUB CHARTERS, CONSTITUTION, & BY-LAWS

It is a state mandate that each 4-H club be chartered. The requirement of a minimum of 6 meetings within a 4-H year (Sept. 1 – Aug. 6) is part of the charter form. Reminder, club meetings must include a complete business meeting, and minutes should be able to be produced. IF YOU DIDN'T TURN IN A COPY OF YOUR CONSITUTION LAST YEAR WE'LL BE CONTACTING YOU FOR IT THIS YEAR. By-laws need submitted every year if changed. The deadline to submit the forms is March 1 (go to 'Volunteers' tab on the website).





ANNUAL FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Club financial reports are required for the calendar year Jan. 1, 2023 thru Dec. 31, 2023. *Reports must be submitted by February 1, 2024.*

4-H ADVISORY COMMITTEE

We are looking for a few new people to sign up for a 3-year term to help guide policy and budget decisions, as well as assist with 4-H and Jr. Fair events. We meet once a month most of the year for an hour to an hour and a half. You must have been an advisor for at least 3 years to be eligible.

ACROSS COUNTY LINES POLICY

OSU Extension policy is that youth should participate in the 4-H program in their county of residence. Each county 4-H program receives money for operation from their county government and local volunteers work hard to support their local programming.

If you have kids interested in joining your club that live out-of-county, they MUST complete a Request for Membership Across County Lines form and submit it to the 4-H educator in the county where membership is being requested. NOTE: This must be done as early as possible in the 4-H year as counties have different enrollment deadlines and the form may need to be processed earlier than our county deadline.

The Policy and Form may be picked up at the Extension Office or printed from our website: ross.osu.edu (4-H Youth Development, 4-H Families) The Ross County deadline for this form to be submitted is February 1.

Permission for 4-H membership across county lines should NOT BE assumed by the parents of the child or advisors until official notification is received from the 4-H staff in the county of request.

QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING

WHO: Exhibitors of Market and Dairy Projects must attend Quality Assurance training annually to show, exhibit and/or sell their animal at the county or state fair.

WHY: This training is mandated by the Ohio Dept. of Agriculture for any producer that contributes to the food industry. This requirement must be met by June 18 (45 days prior to the start of Ross County Fair). If showing at state fair, this must be completed sooner to meet the requirement,



WHEN & WHERE: Ross County Service Center:

- March 21 from 5:00-6:30 pm TEST OUT (only available for 4-H age 15 and up)
- April 16 from 5:00-6:30 pm OR 7:00-8:30 pm
- April 24 from 5:00-6:30 pm OR 7:00-8:30 pm
- May 9 from 5:00-6:30 pm
- June 18 from 5:00-6:30 pm *\$20.00 fee

PRE-REGISTRATION: Is required for all dates by March 1. Members can attend whichever option works best for them Sign up: go.osu.edu/rcqualityassurance

QA TEST OUT: The Test Out Option is for youth ages 15 and up (by January 1)! Anyone can come to the session but those that qualify will be permitted to take a test at the end that if they score high will allow them to "test-out" of QA requirements for the next 3 years.

OTHER OPTIONS: If you cannot attend a Ross Co. QA there are other options to complete -

- For exhibitors 14 years and older, an online QA is available at http://yqcaprogram.org/ for \$12/person. You must use your 4-H Online login to receive credit. You must send a copy of your completion to the Ross County 4-H office. You must show documented completion to receive credit.
- Alternative approved QA trainings in other counties or hosted by specie specific organizations will be
 listed on our website. If you discover a not-listed option you would like to consider attending, please
 call the office and confirm it will meet the requirements BEFORE attending. You must provide a note
 from the county/program you complete QA in to the Ross County 4-H office for it to meet the
 requirement.

What Shooting Sports project is right for your 4-Her?

Understanding the differences between the 700-Level and the 600-Level projects will help advisors and parents find the SS project that best fits the member.

The Ross County 4-H Program offers 2 types of Shooting Sports projects.

- 1. 700-LEVEL. Projects that are taught only by certified Ohio Shooting Sports Instructors. These projects require additional practices and specialized instruction.
 - a. Select from the **700-Level** project disciplines: 750-Rifle; 751-Archery; 753-Pistol; 754-Hunting & Wildlife; 756-Living History.
 - b. Sign up for the project in 4Honline.
 - c. Complete county and your club requirements (i.e. 6 meetings, full participation, dues, etc)
 - d. Must attend discipline classes with a certified Ohio 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor; which includes practice shoots and completing the project book.
 - Pistol, Rifle and Archery classes will be held at the Ross County Conservation League on April 6, 13, 20, 27, & May 4, 2024 from 10:00 am–2:00 pm
 - (Living History and Hunting & Wildlife will be scheduled after project enrollments)
 - e. Attend project evaluation and interview on 4-H Project Judging Day in July.
 - f. Projects are Ohio State Fair eligible.
- 2. 600-LEVEL. Projects that are a Beginning-level, one-time project for members who have Adult supervision (i.e. parent, advisor, grandparent, etc).
 - a. Select from the **600-Level** projects: 630-Safe Use of Guns; 631-Basic Archery
 - b. Sign up for the project in 4Honline.
 - c. Complete county & your club requirements (i.e. 6 meetings, full participation, dues, etc)
 - d. Complete Project book at own pace.
 - e. Attend project evaluation and interview on 4-H Project Judging Day in July.
 - f. Projects are Ohio State Fair eligible.
