OUTSTANDING 4-H SAFETY AND HEALTH OFFICER AWARDS

To be considered for an outstanding 4-H Safety or Health Officer, come to officer interviews on General Project Judging day and bring your binder/scrapbook. The top 2 Officers for both Safety and Health will be recognized with a plaque that will hang in the Junior Fair Building during fair and be presented during the Saturday awards ceremony the last Saturday of fair.

REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Bring your Binder/scrapbook to General Project Judging Day at your club's scheduled time. The Binder/scrapbook must include:
 - a. Evidence that the items on the score sheet were completed. This can include pictures, news clippings, sample materials used, copy of the club program, letters, and other items that showed what the club has done with safety/health programming.
 - b. The completed one-page summary telling about the club's safety or health program.
 - c. Fill in the score sheet with your activities and bring it to your interview.

 Advisor must sign below and can make comments about officer's efforts.
- 2. Only one Binder/scrapbook will be accepted per club AND only one interview will be conducted per club (one individual or one team of 2 members).
- 3. Complete interview judging for outstanding officer award. Interview judging will be held during General Project Judging Day. Members will come during their club's assigned judging time.

OTHER SUGGESTIONS:

- 1. Make an attractive cover for the Binder/scrapbook that includes your club name.
- 2. Include pictures of the Officer(s).
- 3. Organize the report in a logical manner and have a table of contents.
